The Senior All-Star Spotlight Meet, for Track and Field athletes will be held Friday, June 11th and Saturday, June 12th. The meet competes the top senior athletes from Iowa, Illinois, and Wisconsin, and will be held at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville.

Team Iowa Athletes should plan on arriving Friday afternoon with competition being held on Saturday. Coaches are asked to nominate male and female senior athletes in one of several ways:

- 1. An on-line nomination form will be placed on the IATC website by the end of March.
- E-mail the Lead Coaches for Team Iowa. Contact information can be found on the website.
- 3. E-mail the web-editor and he will pass the nominations along to the Lead Team Iowa Coaches.

Athletes invited to compete for team Iowa will be contacted by one of the Team Iowa Coaches. Athletes accepting an invitation to compete will be asked to complete the "Invited Athletes Acceptance and Information Form" found on the website and under the Senior All-Star Meet heading. After the acceptance has been received the accepting athlete will be notified that his/her acceptance has been received. His or Her name and school will then be placed on the "Team Iowa Athletes" list, also found on the website. IATC Hall of Fame Tim Thomas Chairman

PLEASE SUBMIT YOUR NOMINATIONS BY APRIL 1, 2010.

The IATC Hall of Fame committee is always looking for deserving candidates for consideration to the Hall of Fame. We make our selections at the Spring Meeting of the IATC Executive Committee meeting. The 2009 selections were: Coach: Dave Fetterman from Tipton, and Athletes: Tiffany Pedersen from Atlantic and Randy Thompson from Corwith-Wesley-Lu Verne. I have included the guidelines for selection in this newsletter. Applications can be downloaded from our website and submitted to Tim Thomas, IATC Chairman.

IATC Hall of Fame Guidelines

I. Criteria for nomination and selection to IATC Hall of Fame.

a. Coach:

- i. Must have coached a minimum of 20 years at any level.
- ii. Must have had outstanding success at the local level and success at the state level of competition and beyond.
- iii. Must have received the respect of his/her peers in coaching, shown leadership and character.
- iv. Must receive 2/3 vote of the Executive Committee membership present for the final selection.

b. Athlete:

- i. Must have performed in an exemplary manner in Iowa High School
- ii. Competition at the local level, state meet and/or the Drake Relays.
- iii. Must have demonstrated outstanding talents above that of the excellent high school athlete.
- iv. May have performed in a manner to have achieved recognition of talent which did or would make
- v. The athlete competitive at a regional or national level.
- vi. Must have completed their high school career at least 5 years prior to being nominated.
- vii. Must receive 2/3 vote of the Executive Committee membership present for the final selection.

c. Service:

- i. Must have contributed to the sport of Track and Field in Iowa in some significant manner which
- ii. Is recognized by the Executive Committee as a supporter or contributor to the betterment of Track & Field in Iowa.
- iii. Must receive 2/3 vote of the Executive Committee membership present for the final selection.
- II. Other items to be considered in selecting people for the Hall of Fame.
 - a. A maximum of 4 candidates may be selected per year.
 - b. No more than one Service Award per year.
 - c. Final selection will be made at the spring meeting of the IATC Executive Committee.
 - d. If a nominee is on the list for 5 consecutive years without becoming an inductee the name is dropped and it must be resubmitted. The person who submitted the nominee will be notified
 - e. A nominee's name may be submitted by completion of the form found on the IATC website.
